What does a Neighbourhood Resource Centre do? Whatever the neighbourhood needs it to do! In 2017, Staff and volunteers at Crouch Neighbourhood Resource Centre:

- Supported the St. Julien Park Festival, the Country Hoedown and the Railway Heritage Festival
- Provided fresh food and vegetables from 5 community gardens and the Good Food Box program
- Served lunch and provided support for 60 100 men every Thursday (52 weeks) at Egerton St. Baptist Church
- Provided emergency food to almost 1,000 people
- Helped people to find affordable housing, access government benefits, access mental health supports, leave abusive relationships, receive addiction support...
- Provided workshops on money management
- Provided drop-in pre-school fun for children and caregivers
- Provided education on preparing affordable, nutritious meals
- Involved children in healthy meal preparation
- Provided afterschool nutrition, recreation, games and crafts
- Provided summertime fun for neighbourhood children and youth
- Hosted Saturday morning adventures to Storybook Gardens, Pioneer Village, Children's Museum and more

Congratulations to the CNRC and their amazing staff on another year of outstanding achievement and a heartfelt thank you for creating such a positive impact in our neighbourhood.




